

A wildlife-friendly oasis....

The Lewiston Wildlife Habitat Area is a wildlife-friendly oasis located within the city limits.

Registered with the National Wildlife Federation as a "Backyard Wildlife Habitat Area," the five-acre area provides an excellent setting to observe wild birds, mammals and aquatic creatures. A one half-mile, paved path meanders through meadows and a small forest with a variety of trees and shrubs. Deer, coyote, raccoon, rabbit, skunks, amphibians, reptiles, and as many as 115 bird species have been observed here.

Fly catchers, American Kestrel, California Quail, Ring-necked Pheasant and numerous species of warblers and finches are common. Unusual sightings include Northern Saw-whet Owl, Cinnamon Teal, Wood Duck, Sora Rail, Spotted Sandpiper, Blue Jay, Harris' Sparrow, Northern Bobwhite and Lazuli Bunting.

This area is disabled accessible. Only wheelchairs and walking are allowed — pets, bicycles and skateboards are not.

Open anytime to self-guided tours, quiet visits to observe nature or relaxation, this area was made for wildlife with you being a temporary visitor.

Driving Directions

- From the north side of Lewiston, follow U.S. Highway 12 across the bridge over the Clearwater River, stay in the left lane and head up 21st Street at the stoplight.
- Follow 21st Street (also called Thain) south up the hill to the 10th Street stoplight.
- Take a left turn at this stoplight and then an immediate right turn on Warner Avenue. Travel 1.5 miles on Warner Ave. to the end of the road.
- The area is on the right, 100 yards before the end of the Warner Ave. Parking is available on a graveled area bounded by a rail fence, including a paved handicap parking space.

Bird Checklist

The Lewiston Wildlife Habitat Area has become a great, yet little known, bird viewing area in the Lewiston-Clarkston Valley. 115 species of birds have been observed here.

Owned by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, the five acre area contains a diversity of trees, shrubs, grasses, flowers, food plots, stream, and pond, making it an ideal birding area. An observation shelter with one-way glass provide an extra close view of the birds. A key is available at the Fish and Game office adjacent to the habitat area.
